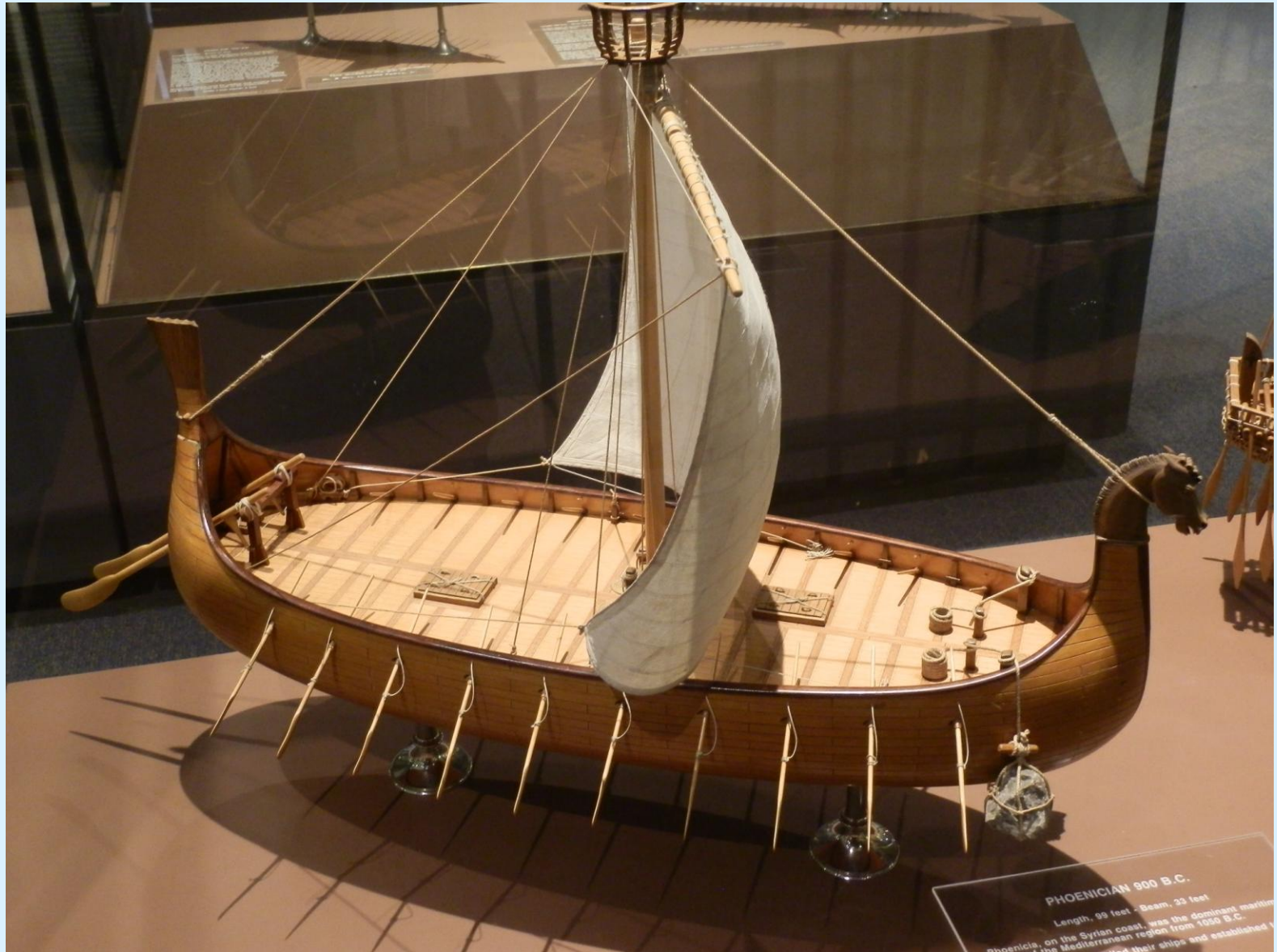


# Ancient Sailing Ships

The following photographs are of ancient ship models that are part of a display at Northeastern University in Boston. They are historically and scale accurate based on many sources of primary historical evidence.

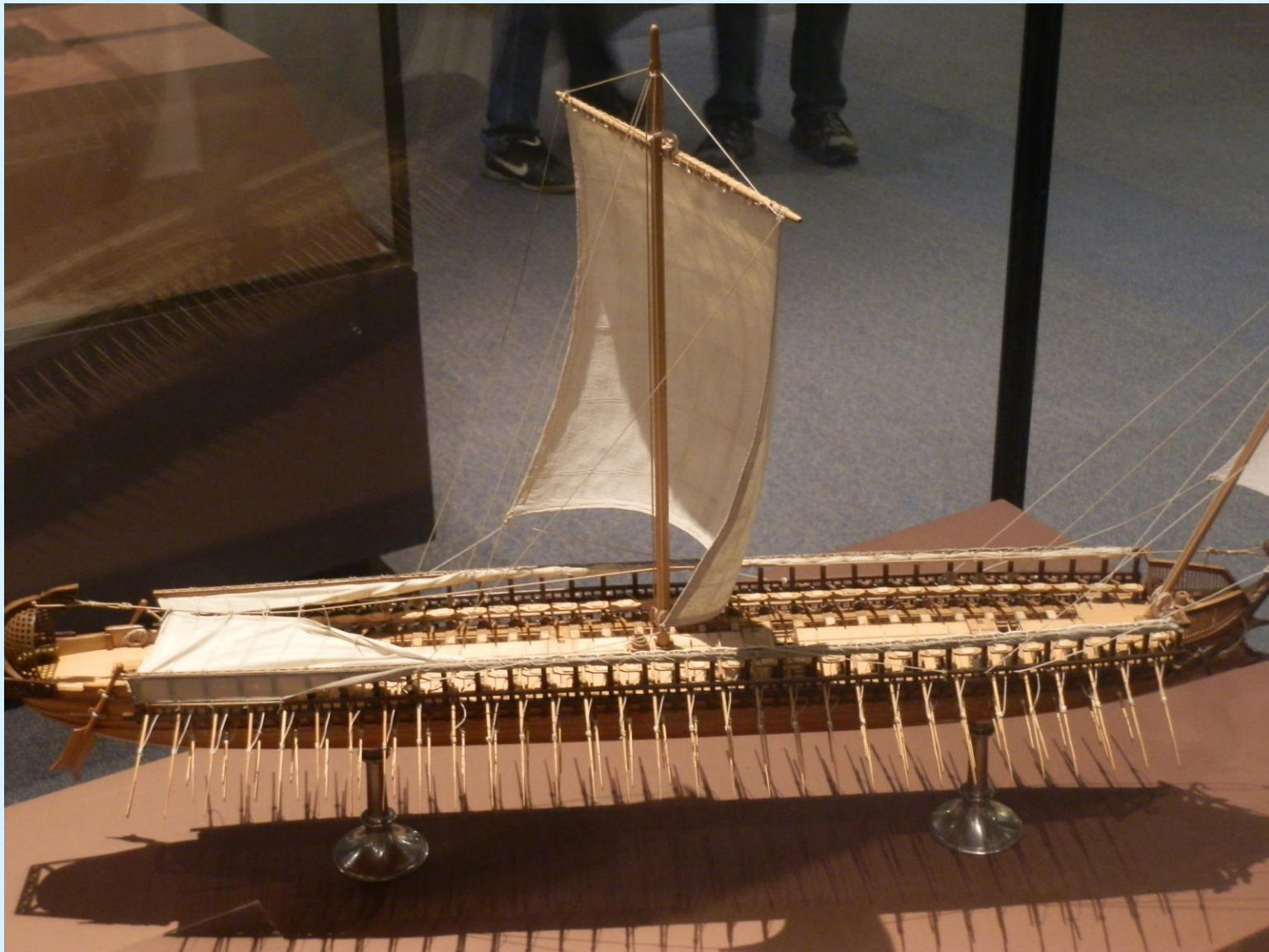
# Phoenician ship from 900 B.C.

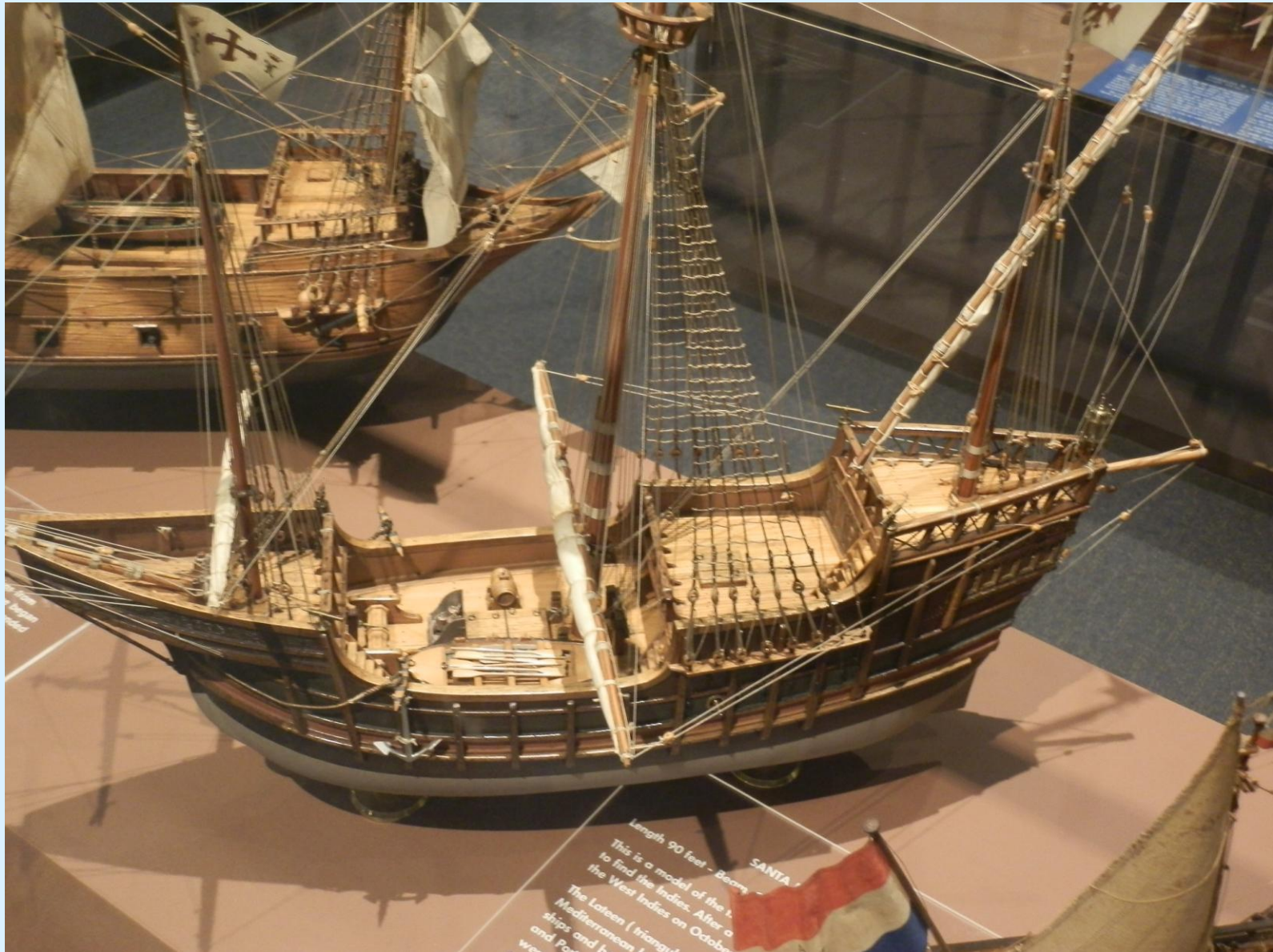

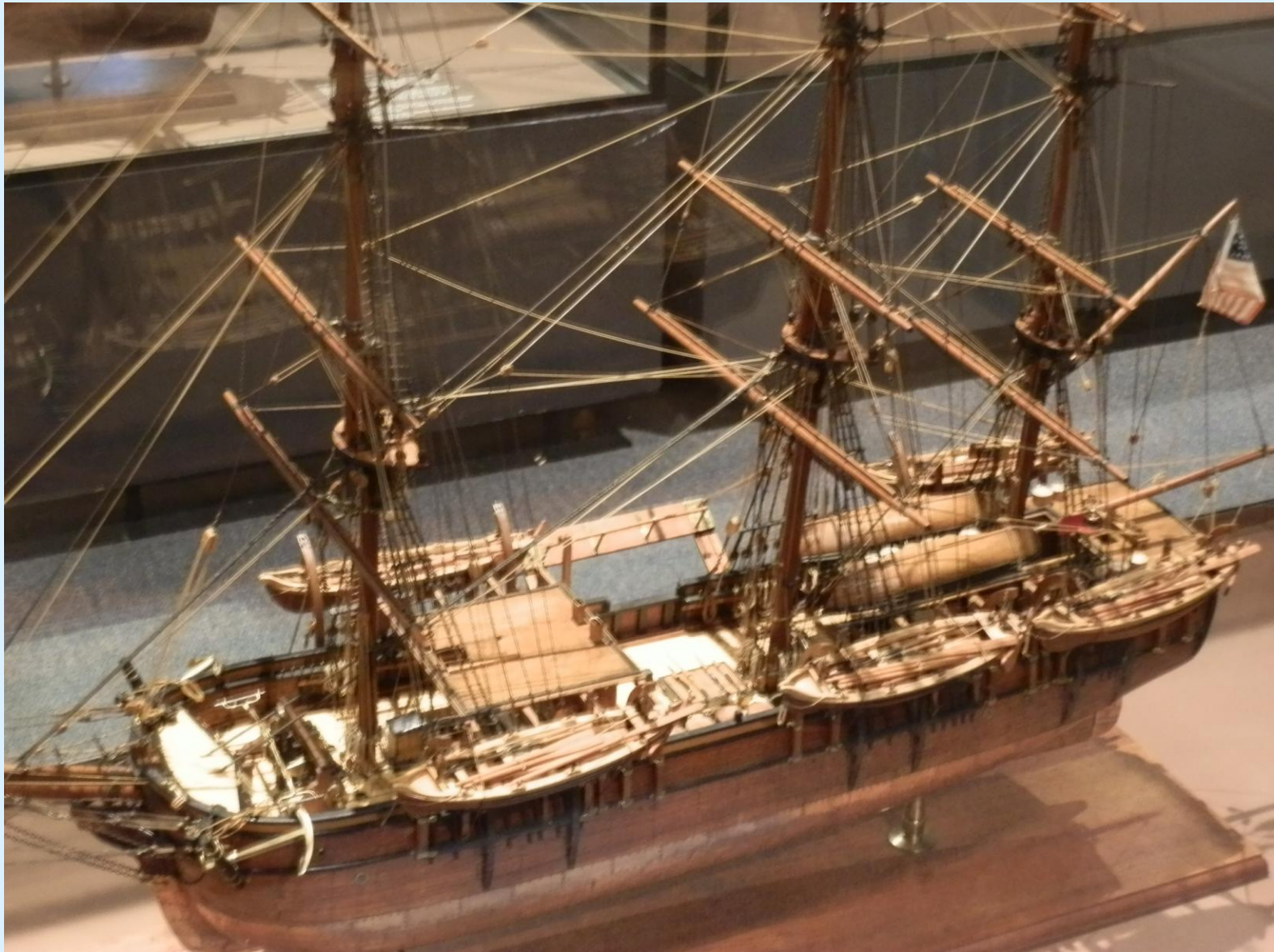

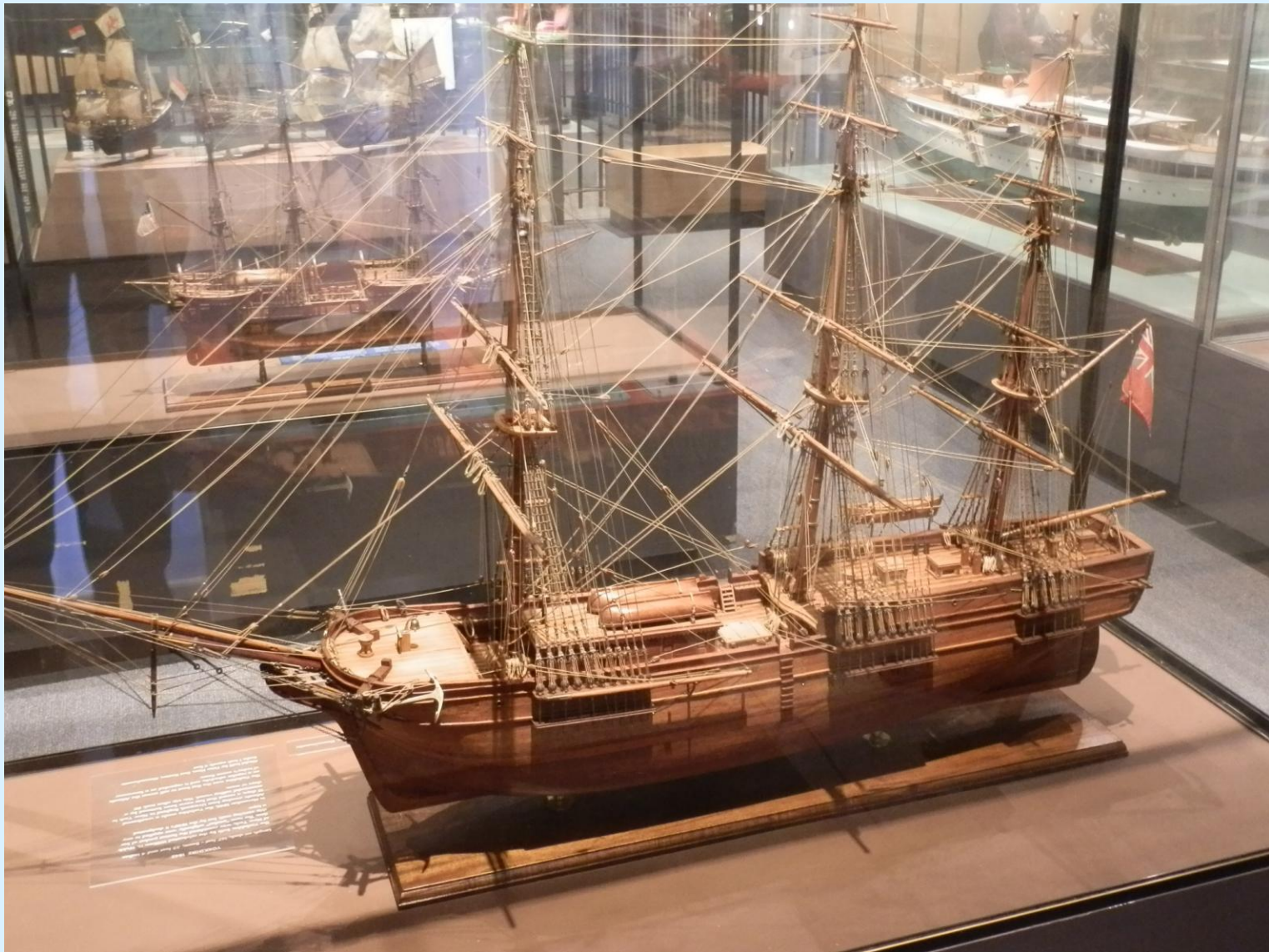
