All tests, including the January Examination, will be according to the school calendar. Advance notice will be given on the material covered.

I suggest that you buy an AP World History: Modern review book by January 2024. There are several choices on the subject. Find the one that reads and works best for you, they are different.

I will discuss the issue of review books at a later date, once I have seen the 2024 editions.


Other Items of Note
